

Progress without restraint!



According to an RAC survey 72% of drivers view motorway speed limits as targets.

- 81% said they saw drivers 'excessively speeding'
- 58% admitted speeding.

When will they ever learn!



During a two-week trial last year in Humber, AI speed cameras caught 849 drivers breaking road rules. Deployed by Safer Roads Humber for one week each in March and June, the cameras detected various violations. They recorded 533 drivers not wearing seat belts, including two children under 14 in the front seats. Additionally, 301 motorists were using mobile phones while driving, and 13 drivers were not in proper control of their vehicles.


